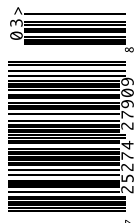

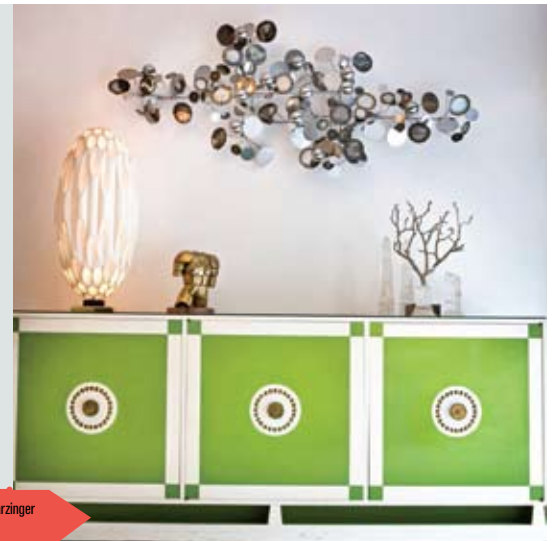
Store It!
